



## *Delivering Justice to the Community:* **Public Informational Talks**

Have you ever found yourself in a dispute and want to have it resolved? But how should you proceed? Should you file a Magistrate’s Complaint? Will your claim be accepted by the Small Claims Tribunals? Where do you go to apply for protection from harassment? How do you take your civil claim to trial?

In conjunction with SG50 and the commemoration of the State Courts Building’s 40<sup>th</sup> year, a series of public informational talks have been organised to let you know about the various legal avenues provided by the State Courts for resolving your disputes. Speakers from the State Courts will provide information to help you navigate the court system, while the Legal Aid Bureau, the Pro Bono Services Office of the Law Society of Singapore and Community Justice Centre will let you know where you may seek legal assistance, and experienced lawyers will address your queries related to the law. Through this series of talks, you will gain a better understanding of the State Courts’ processes for the dispute resolution mode that you may be considering.
